
Lord of all life, you created the universe where all things reflect your glory. You give us this great and beautiful earth to discover and to cherish.

▼ more and more to be like him.


Make us joyful as we celebrate his death for us on the cross and his rising from the dead; and share these gifts which strengthen us to follow him.
